

The meeting that was called to order by Supervisor Landi at 7 PM with the pledge to the flag and a moment of silence.

Present were Councilman Hoffman, Councilman Nelson, and Councilman Wells. Councilman Queipo was absent. Also present were Highway Superintendent Ed Moore, Zoning Board of Appeals Chairman Blake Jackson, Town Justice Richard Alberstadt, Zoning Board of Appeals Member Harry Sleight, Daily Freeman reporter Bill Kemble and Town Attorney Ashley Torre. Three residents were also present.

Supervisor Landi announced that any questions regarding 530 Route 28 or 850 Route 28 will be referred to our Town Attorney.

A motion by Supervisor Landi and seconded by Councilman Nelson to approve all the April minutes that were reviewed by the Town Board prior to the meeting be accepted. All approved.

Supervisor Landi read the Supervisors Report and Town Clerk Weiss read the Town Clerk's report.

The general bills, highway bills and intrafund transfers were reviewed by the Town Board.

Interfund Transfers

Councilman Wells made the motion, seconded by Councilman Nelson to transfer from A230.7 Supervisors Investment into A1220.4 Supervisors Contractual \$5,827.50 to cover expenses. All Approved.

General and Highway Bills

A motion was made by Supervisor Landi and seconded by Councilman Hoffman to pay the following general bills Claim #188 thru #214 totaling \$27,311.94 and highway bills Claim #215 thru #223, totaling \$3,541.90. All approved. (See Minute Book for a breakdown of the actual bills).

Councilman Nelson reported that all things are quiet in the area. Councilman Queipo, Councilman Nelson, and the Undersheriff met in the Town Hall. The Sheriff is considering using the conference room for the sheriff's department when they are on duty in the Town of Kingston. The Undersheriff stated that no suspects will be held in the building. Councilman Nelson hoped that the Sheriff Departments coverage for our Town will start in the next 30 days.

Councilman Hoffman reports that the burn ban will expire on May 14th. Highway Superintendent Moore stated that the work done on Powder Mill Bridge and the bridge by the Town Hall was completed. The Highway Department had cleaned ditches on Sawkill Park Road and Hill Road. They will be installing culvert pipes on Hill Road, Waughkonk Road and Dogwood Lane.

Councilman Wells reported that he had received 2 applicants for the Summer Rec Counselors position. He hoped to set-up interviews during the next week. Code Enforcement Officer Cologero collected \$750 in April - \$700 of that was for building permits. Councilman Wells read Town Historian Queipo's report (see attached).

Supervisor Landi reminded everyone that Spring clean-up will be this Saturday (May 7th). Spectrum will address complaints made by town residents. The Town is still taking applications for alternates to the Planning Board.

Town Clerk Weiss updated the Town Board on the status of the webpage.

Questions and Comments – Sean O’Connor, of Hill Road, gave the Town Board pictures showing the recent flooding on Hill Road (none given to the Town Clerk). The water was in his house on the corner of Hill Road and Sawkill Road. He stated that the road has been in bad condition for the last few years.

Harry Sleight, of Hill Road, read a letter to the Town Board (letter attached), concerning the road condition near his house. He stated that this has been going on for about 15 years.

Highway Superintendent Moore and the Highway Department, hopefully with the County will check on the Hill Road situation. Councilman Hoffman asked if the Town Engineer should also look at Hill Road.

Motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Wells, seconded by Councilman Nelson. All approved. The meeting was adjourned at 7:40PM.
