

Supervisor Landi called the workshop to order at 7 PM. Present were Supervisor Landi, Councilman Hoffman, Councilman Nelson, Councilman Queipo, and Councilman Wells. Highway Superintendent Moore, Zoning Board of Appeals Chairman Blake Jackson, Code Enforcement Officer Bob Cologero, Town Attorney Kelly Naughton and 4 residents were also present.

Committee Reports

Councilman Nelson reported that an appearance ticket will be issued to the owner of the property by the Town Line. Code Enforcement Officer Cologero and Town Attorney Kelly Naughton will work on the appearance ticket. Code Enforcement Officer Cologero suggested that the Town look into passing a local law on having the cost of cleaning up someone's property be added onto their taxes. The Planning Board held their public hearing on 530 Route 28 on April 18th. The public will have until the close of business (5PM) on April 29th to email or mail any comments about the 530 Route 28 project.

Councilman Nelson made the motion, seconded by Councilman Hoffman to give former Planning Board Chairman John Konior a \$200 gift card for all his years of service to the Town. All Approved.

Councilman Hoffman reported about residents burning in the Meadows (once the burn ban is lifted). The local law that was passed in 2005 would prohibit burning in the Meadows. The Town Board will revisit that local law to see if distances from other neighboring properties can be changed. During Thursday evening heavy rainstorm, the Highway Department did an amazing job on saving the house on the bottom of Hill Road.

Highway Superintendent Moore reported that the end of Hill Road was bad. A County pipe was blocked. The County will put in a new culvert pipe. The Town of Esopus will help move a culvert pipe from house on left. Sawkill Park Road and Morey Hill Road has similar problems. Highway Department will be working to unplug a pipe on Dogwood Lane. The Highway Department bought 110 tons of salt before the price goes up.

Councilman Wells reported that the ad for Recreation Counselors will begin on 4/21 and run for 7 days.

Councilman Queipo reported that the Ulster County Sheriff is out of Town. He will be meeting with the Undersheriff on Thursday. Councilman Nelson will also be attending the meeting. The Sheriff had stated that he did not have a car for the Town, but has since found a car that can be used in this substation. The speaker system should be delivered this week.

Supervisor Landi asked the residents for their comments on renewing the Spectrum contract. Many comments were made concerning pricing, service, having to ask for credit when Spectrum is down. Town Attorney Naughton said there was a very narrow line on what changes you can make to the contract. The Board will speak to Spectrum to try to alleviate some of the customers concerns.

Councilman Nelson made the motion, seconded by Councilman Wells, to authorize Supervisor Landi to sign a contract with Net Prophet to design and develop a new website for the Town of Kingston. The cost not to exceed \$4,500.

All Approved.

Town Clerk Weiss and Town Attorney Naughton will be working on making changes to the fee schedule.

Councilman Queipo made the motion, seconded by Councilman Hoffman to pay the bills presented at the meeting. All Approved.

Councilman Nelson made the motion, seconded by Councilman Hoffman to move for adjournment. All Approved. The meeting was adjourned at 7:45 PM.
