

The regular Town Board meeting was called to order by Supervisor Landi at 7:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and a moment of silence.

Present were Councilman Nelson, Councilman Queipo, Councilman Wells. Councilman Hoffman was absent.

Also present were Town Attorney Kelly Naughton, Zoning Board of Appeals Councilman Blake Jackson, Highway Superintendent Ed Moore, and one resident.

A motion by Supervisor Landi and seconded by Councilman Nelson to approve the May 2023 minutes. All approved.

Supervisor Landi read the Supervisor's Report and the Town Clerk's Report was not read in absence of the Town Clerk.

The general bills, highway bills and interfund transfers were reviewed by the Town Board.

Interfund Transfer

A motion was made by Supervisor Landi and seconded by Councilman Wells to transfer from Highway Superintendent Investment into D5148.4 – Miscellaneous Services \$5,000.00 to cover expenses. All approved.

General and Highway Bills

Councilman Queipo made a motion which was seconded by Councilman Nelson to pay the following:

general bills: Claim #200 through #231 totaling \$17,168.16 and

highway bills: Claim #232 through #245 totaling \$52,726.49. All approved.

Committee Reports

Councilman Nelson reported that the Give-a-Book Take-a-Book library was installed outside and thanked Sawkill Seniors for the book donations.

Councilman Wells reported that the town calendar is now on the new web-site. He stated that the Summer Kick-Off had approximately 80-90

people and went well. He thanked Bob Cologero and Vinny Nelson for cooking, DJ Eddie Parker for the music, and the Fire Company for the ice.

Councilman Wells stated that \$2,405.00 was collected in building permits and he further reported that Summer Rec will start on July 5, 2023 and be on Mondays through Thursdays with two of the women returning and one new to run the rec.

Highway Superintendent Ed Moore told the Board that Ruby and Hill Roads were chip sealed in May. He said that the Town has a new heavy equipment operator, and they will begin cleaning brush on the roadsides.

It was noted by Supervisor Landi that the people who dropped furniture on the roadside were found and arrested.

Councilman Queipo read the Historian's Report which stated that the Memorial Day Ceremony had the best turn out since before the COVID epidemic with 90 people attending. Thanks went to Ronald Chrisey (upkeep of memorial), Richard Alberstadt (invocation), the Boy Scouts, and Carolyn Marosy who lent the PA system for the event.

The Historian's Report went on further that there is going to be a gravestone cleaning at St. Ann's on June 10th and the boy scouts will be coming to help.

Supervisor Landi stated that the spring clean-up had no issues and that the short-term rentals proposed law will come to the Board for review from the lawyers.

Old Business

The resident present had a complaint about the paving and dirt hills that needed to be leveled and a problem with the guard rail. There was no news on the County issue of the catch basin. The resident asked that the "No Shoulder" sign be taken down.

New Business

Three applications were received for alternates to the Planning Board and they are still being interviewed.

The Fire Company will have a drill on the field June 25th.

Town offices will be closed July 5th for the Independence Day holiday.

Questions and Comments

The cable company is beginning to lay cable. There are grants that will help pay for it.

A motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Nelson and seconded by Councilman Wells. All approved. The meeting was adjourned at 7:23 PM.
