

The Town Board meeting was called to order by Supervisor Landi at 7:01pm with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and a moment of silence.

Present were, Councilman Queipo, Councilman Wells and Supervisor Landi. Councilman Hoffman, Councilman Nelson were excused. Also present were Highway Superintendent Sylvester, Code Enforcement Officer Cologero, Town Historian Heddleson, Town Clerk, Linda Nelson and 7 members of the public.

A motion was made by Supervisor Landi and seconded by Councilman Wells to approve the June 2024 meeting minutes as read. All approved.

Supervisor Landi read the Supervisor's report.

Town Clerk Linda Nelson read the June Town Clerk's report. The Town took in \$80.50 in dog license fees and \$50.00 in registrar fees, for a total of \$130.50 in fees.

Councilman Queipo made a motion that was seconded by Councilman Wells to approve and pay general bills claim #264 thru #290 totaling \$17,333.33 and Highway bills claim #290 thru #300 totaling \$4,546.25. All approved.

Councilman Wells read Code Enforcement Officer Cologero's report, he collected \$989.00 in fees for the month, \$394.00 in building permits, \$100.00 in abstract fees, \$20.00 for a safety inspection and \$475.00 for short term rental inspections. Town Rec summer program started today, there was a good turn out for it. Summer Kick-off party was a success with good food, music and a great turnout. He has requested a loan of a digital speed limit sign from the county and whether or not it can be placed on a county road. It was also brought up that lowering the speed limits for town roads is being looked into.

Councilman Queipo brought up the matter of trying to put together a committee review our comprehensive plan and is looking into consultants to help with that. He also mention that there would be a mention of Allen Lund on the sign board out front. He also mentioned a issue with the website concerning the Town Historian page.

Town Clerk Nelson mentioned that she is a Commissioned Notary Public now if services are needed. She also mentioned the Text My Gov program will be up and running by June 15th for people to opt in and receive notifications about happenings in the Town of Kingston.

Historian Heddleson mentioned a book she will be donating to the Town of Kingston library, by a local author.

Code Enforcement Cologero inspected 765 Sawkill Rd and is looking into pushing for more aggressive actions toward the property owner since there is not enough action being taken by the property owner to clean up the property and make it safe. The property owner

contacted Senator Michelle Hinchey, it was stated that resident were more then welcome to send statements to her as well if they feel that the property is unsafe or unkept.

A resident commented that he was thankful for the summer kick-off party and that he had seen that the Sherriff is starting patrols up again.

Another resident brought up property being residential next to a possible commercial property and what can be done about it. She commented about zoning issues not being available and was told that Town of Kingston zoning laws are listed on our website.

Supervisor Landi thanked everyone again in there help with the Summer Kick-off party and Councilman Wells for getting the Summer Rec program up and running.

A motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Queipo and seconded by Councilman Wells. All approved. The meeting was adjourned at 7:24PM.
