

The Town Board meeting was called to order by Supervisor Landi at 7pm with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and a moment of silence.

Present were Councilman Hoffman, Councilman Nelson, Councilman Queipo and Supervisor Landi. Councilman Wells was excused. Also, present were Judge Alberstadt, Town Bookkeeper Haubrich, Historian Heddleson and Town Attorney Goodge. Approximately 15 members of the public were in attendance.

Supervisor Landi made a motion to approve the November 2025 minutes; it was seconded by Councilman Nelson. All approved.

Supervisor Landi read the Supervisor's Report. Town Clerk Nelson read the November Town Clerk's reports.

A motion was made by Councilman Queipo to make the 2 interfund transfers for the bills; it was seconded by Councilman Hoffman. All approved.

A motion was made by Councilman Hoffman to pay the general and highway bills; it was seconded by Councilman Nelson. All approved.

Councilman Hoffman mentioned that as of the first of the year the board meetings will be held on Mondays, starting with January 5<sup>th</sup>. They will still be at 7pm.

Councilman Nelson reported the Building Inspector collected \$330.00 in fees this month, 2 building permits and 2 abstracts.

He also thanked the Sawkill fire dept for spreading holiday cheer through the town as well as keeping everyone updated online. He also thanked all the residents that showed up to the tree lighting, especially Linda Queipo for leading the caroling.

A resident questioned the couple abandoned vehicles in the parking lot, it was answered that one of the vehicles belongs to the fire department for training and the other belongs to the owner of the house on Sawkill rd. that was hit by the truck, as they called and asked permission to park it in the lot while their house is being fixed. He also questioned the difference of amounts in the Parkland fee account vs. what should be in the account. It was explained that the missing amount he questioned was just read of as a deposit from the clerk's office this evening and that is why it wasn't showing up in the saving account as of the week before.

Supervisor Landi wanted to thank Larry Queipo for all the years he has put in on the Town Board as well as other areas of the town he has been a part of, he recognized him with a plaque for being on the Town Board since 1990. He has been in service to the town for almost 50 years in one form or another.

Larry Queipo expressed the joy he has had working with and for the town over the years, as he will continue to do so if needed just not in the same capacity.

Deb Haubrich presented Paul Landi with a plaque in recognition for his service as Town Supervisor from 2009-2025, he has also been in other positions and has been in service to the town for approximately 20 years.

Supervisor Landi Expressed his joy from over the years being Supervisor, he has worked with many amazing people during that time, including his bookkeeper Deb Haubrich, Judge Alberstadt, as well as his current Board members he has next to him today. He thanked Frank Brogden, Ernie Smith, and Dennis Weiss (may they rest in peace) for everything they did for the town over their years in service here.

Cheryl Landi thanked the board for the work they do as not many towns have board members out there during emergencies right alongside the fire department and EMS to help residents and make sure everyone is safe, but that is exactly what this town has.

Linda Queipo invited all the residents at the meeting to stay for refreshments after the meeting to celebrate Councilman Queipo and Supervisor Landi.

A motion to adjourn the Town Board meeting was made by Supervisor Landi and seconded by Councilman Queipo. All approved. The meeting was adjourned at 7:48PM.
