

Supervisor Hoffman opened Town Board meeting at 7:00PM with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and a moment of silence. He then pointed out the fire exits.

Present were Councilman Hurley, Councilman Moore, Councilman Wells and Supervisor Hoffman. Also present were Town Attorney Goodge, Planning Board Chair Sliva, ZBA member Janselewitz, Town Clerk Nelson and 9 members of the public. Councilman Nelson was excused.

Councilman Wells made a motion to accept the minutes from April's meeting; it was seconded by Councilman Hurley. All approved

Supervisor Hoffman explained that the Supervisor's report is available for viewing on the bulletin board throughout the meeting.

Town Clerk Nelson read the town clerk's report.

Councilman Wells made a motion to pay the General town bills claims #142-161 totaling \$18,689.39 and the Highway town bills claims #162-169 totaling \$2,677.16, it was seconded by Councilman Hurley. All approved.

Councilman Wells mentioned possibly having a farmer's market on the Town property, we are still waiting to hear back from our insurance company before going forward.

Councilman Moore noted the Highway department is still working on ditches around town, as of right now they are working on Gray Ln. and then moving over to Waughkonk Rd. They are doing a good job.

Councilman Hurley will be holding the next comprehensive plan meeting on May 13th, they will be looking at air b n b's, registered and not registered, detailing vacant lots and water surveys for Hill Rd.

Planning board chair Sliva mentioned new trainings are available and Town Board has access to them as well, Councilman Wells mentioned he had signed up for his first 4 classes and is looking forward to taking them.

Supervisor Hoffman mentioned the Memorial Day Ceremony will be held on Monday May 25th at 10am. Mr. & Mrs. Queipo will be doing a slideshow

and a movie inside after the ceremony outside and as well as refreshments.

Councilman Hurley mentioned he and Councilman Moore took a ride through town yesterday with a list of advertised Air B&B's, most were not registered, also found some houses that need to be condemned as well as some other things.

Supervisor Hoffman mentioned that town residents Kathy & Doug Renaud and another couple Debbie & Jerry Brown, would like permission to plant a tree on town property in memory of both of their sons who would have celebrated their 50th birthday this year. He made a motion to allow them to plant a tree on town property in a board approved location it was seconded by Councilman Wells. All approved.

Councilman Wells made a motion to pass the resolution #29-2026, an amendment to Law #115, regarding animals on town property, it was seconded by Supervisor Hoffman. It was approved 3-1.

Councilman Wells made a motion to pass the resolution #30-2026, an amendment to Law #321, regarding solid waste laws in the Town of Kingston, including the size of trash receptacles, time the receptacles should be put out and taken in by and being removed from the roadside at least 20 feet, it was seconded by Supervisor Hoffman. All approved

A resident questioned where the Town was at with the reassessment. Supervisor Hoffman mentioned he had spoken to the assessor and hopefully it will be in process in August.

Supervisor Hoffman motioned to adjourn the meeting, it was seconded by Councilman Moore. All Approved. The meeting was adjourned at 7:25PM.
